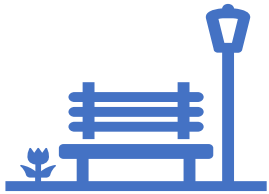

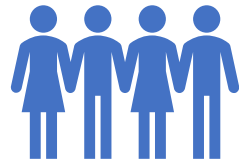

School Day Timings



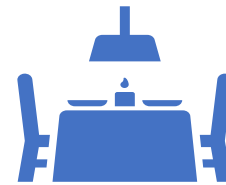
Miss Cameron to be on the playground for approximately 8:25am, ready to take class up at 8:30am.

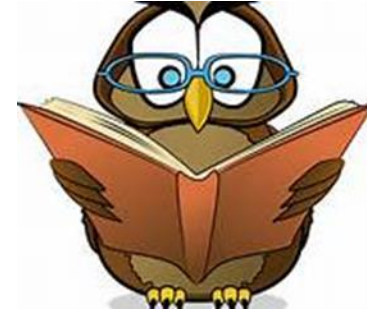

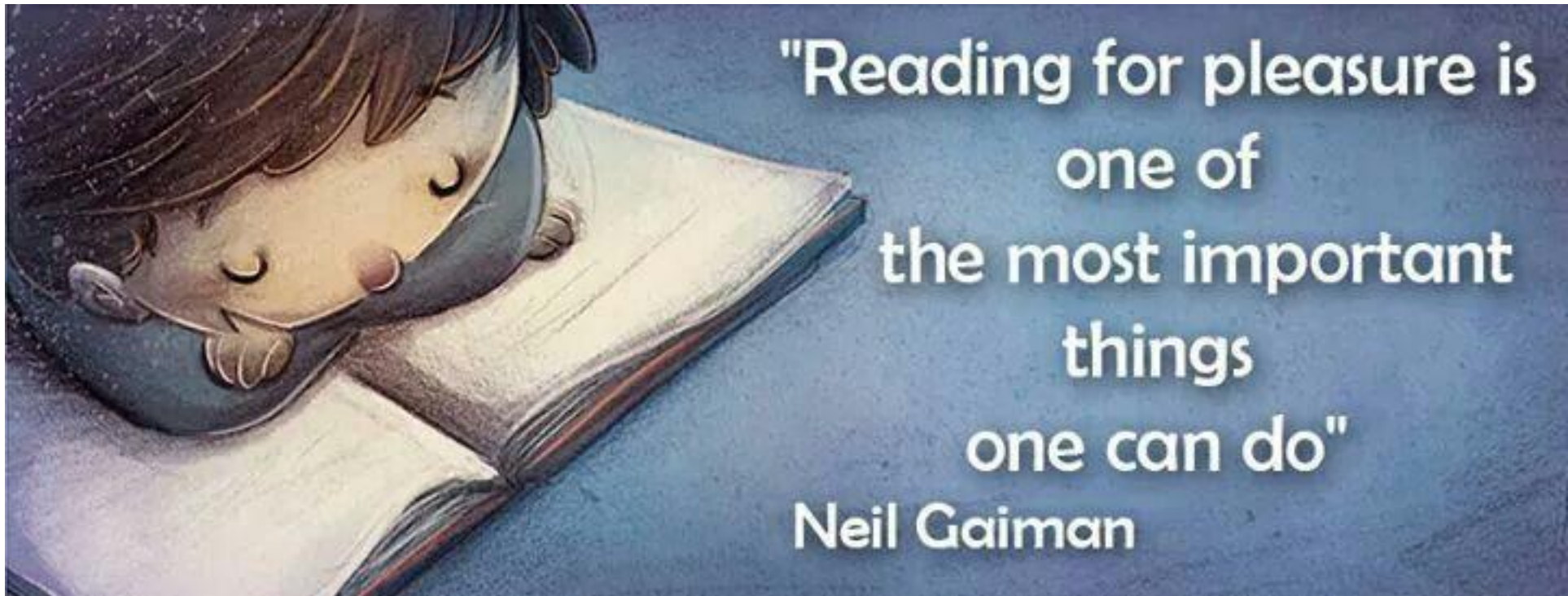
Homework

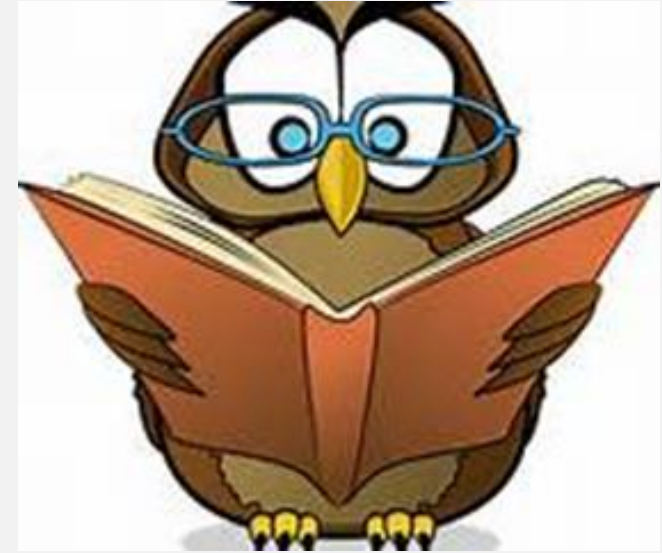
