



SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

Overall aim of the policy:

The aims of this policy are to make all children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance; to contribute to a sense of belonging and community and to foster a feeling of pride for their school.

The uniform is designed with health & safety in mind, to look smart, wear well and to offer good value for money.

National guidance:

The policy was drawn up using a range of national documents including statutory guidance on the cost of school uniform.

The policy applies to all pupils.

The policy states

- ❖ That **ALL** children wear the uniform
- ❖ Children are encouraged to maintain a good standard of clean and tidy dress in school
- ❖ Hair accessories such as slides, ribbons, bobbles etc. should be fairly simple and in school colours
- ❖ For safety reasons no jewellery is allowed in school with the exception of a watch and only small, plain studs if children have pierced ears
- ❖ Children are not allowed to take part in P.E. lessons if they are wearing earrings. They need to be able to remove the earrings themselves. Staff are not able to help remove them
- ❖ Our uniform is designed to be practical, maintainable and good value for money
- ❖ For health reasons it is important that children are properly dressed for physical activity
- ❖ On your child's allocated P.E. days they should come to school dressed in their P.E. kit with either the school tracksuit *OR* school sweatshirt over the top
- ❖ Nail varnish should not be worn in school
- ❖ Sensible, smart, black shoes should be worn, or **ALL** black trainers

Role of the PTA

- ❖ To receive, sort and clean donated items of school uniform
- ❖ To promote and arrange a sale of second hand uniform every half-term

Involvement of parents/carers

We ask that parents ensure

- ❖ **ALL** clothing and accessories (book bags, water bottles) are clean and clearly labelled with their child's name
- ❖ Their child comes to school in weather appropriate clothes – i.e., coats and warm clothes in the winter; outdoor shoes/wellies to use for outdoor play

The Role of the Governors

- ❖ The Governing Body supports the Headteacher in implementing the School Uniform Policy
- ❖ It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the Headteacher to ensure the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity

Equality Impact Assessment

As a school community we have a commitment to promote equality and eliminate discrimination. We believe this policy is in line with the Equality Act 2010 as it is fair, does not prioritise or disadvantage any pupil and helps to promote equality in school.

Monitoring and Review

- ❖ The School Uniform Policy is reviewed by seeking the views of parents to ensure that they agree with and support the policy
- ❖ Consideration is given by the Headteacher to any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensation with regard to school uniform
- ❖ We have a single-supplier contract with Schoolwear Inc for *branded* items of uniform
- ❖ Tenders for uniform suppliers are run every 5 years to ensure our uniform is still offered at a competitive price
